Lastly, it is a genuine team effort in making sure that your child has a positive future, and we urge all parents to be mindful of where your child is and what they are up to outside of the school day. A healthy start to the school day begins with a fresh focus after a good night's sleep. Young people need sleep far more than adults, so a reasonable amount of rest is crucial to good learning in the classroom the next day.

Finally, we will be focusing on reading in our centres and to bring back the joy of what a book can give both to young and not so young people! It is something that is so crucial to everything we do in life and reading not just helps with your child's literacy but also expands their minds and views about the world that we live in! Your support in helping your child to read will be greatly appreciated and as a school we promise to make sure we give access to this with books on offer in all classrooms.


Trips to the Adur Centre
